

As decided in May in Kastanienbaum (SUI), a team of EC panelists met at GFZ in Potsdam to define the principles for the new plan. Writing teams, a broad structure and design principles have been defined. A draft will be presented at our next panel meetings in 2020.

Our <u>annual program report</u> that lists all ICDP activities will be available end of January.

Looking back, 2019 was an exciting and busy year for our program. The Eger Rift project continued in 2019 and will go on into 2020. Since this fall GRIND is in full swing in Namibia, where the new mobile Drilling Information System was successfully tested for the first time in the field.

2020 will also be exciting with a start of actions in early January with the <u>Cornell</u> workshop on sustainable geothermal energy production in Ithaca, New York, USA. By mid-January we expect several new <u>proposal submissions</u>. The <u>JET</u> project is going to run from March onwards and <u>Trans Amazon</u> is planning to start drilling in summer. The <u>NicaBridge</u> workshop will be held in early March while the <u>Lake Izabal</u> workshop is scheduled to take place in August.
