What is the DFG?

Germany's central, self-governing research funding organisation

Member institutions include

- ▶ German universities (69)
- ▶ non-university research institutions (16)
- ▶ German academies of sciences and humanities (8)
- ▶ scientific associations (3)

What is the DFG?

An association under German private law

The DFG is funded by

- ▶ German federal government (67,5%)
- ▶ German states (32.4%)
- ▶ Private sources (0.1%)*



The DFG's 2015 budget totalled approx. **€ 2.99 billion**.

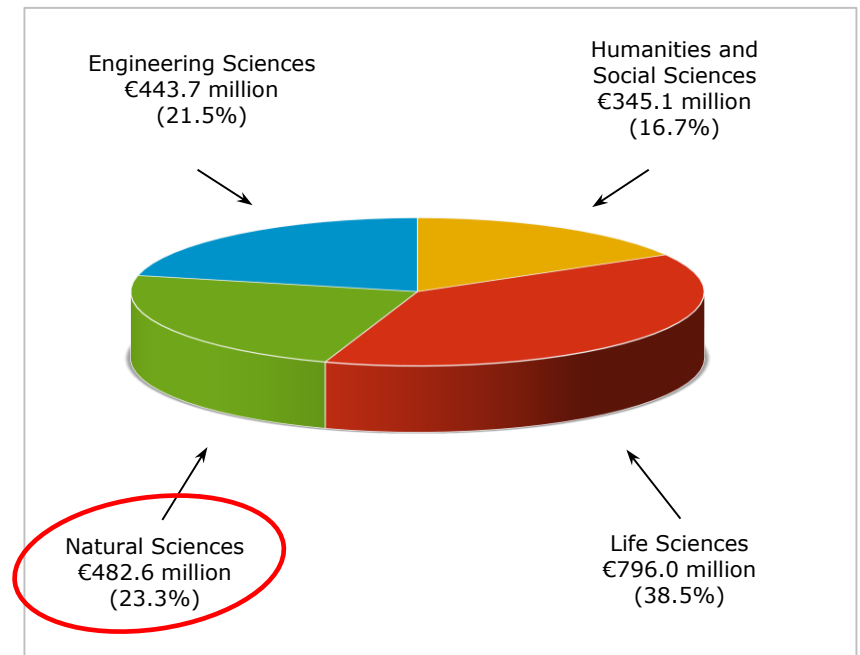

UNESCO

to support

- ▶ Scientific work related to active drilling proposals
- ▶ Follow-up projects, (on-site, archive material)
- ▶ Pre-site surveys

Eligibility

- ▶ Researchers from all disciplines at German research institutions who have completed their scientific training (in most cases by achieving their doctorates)



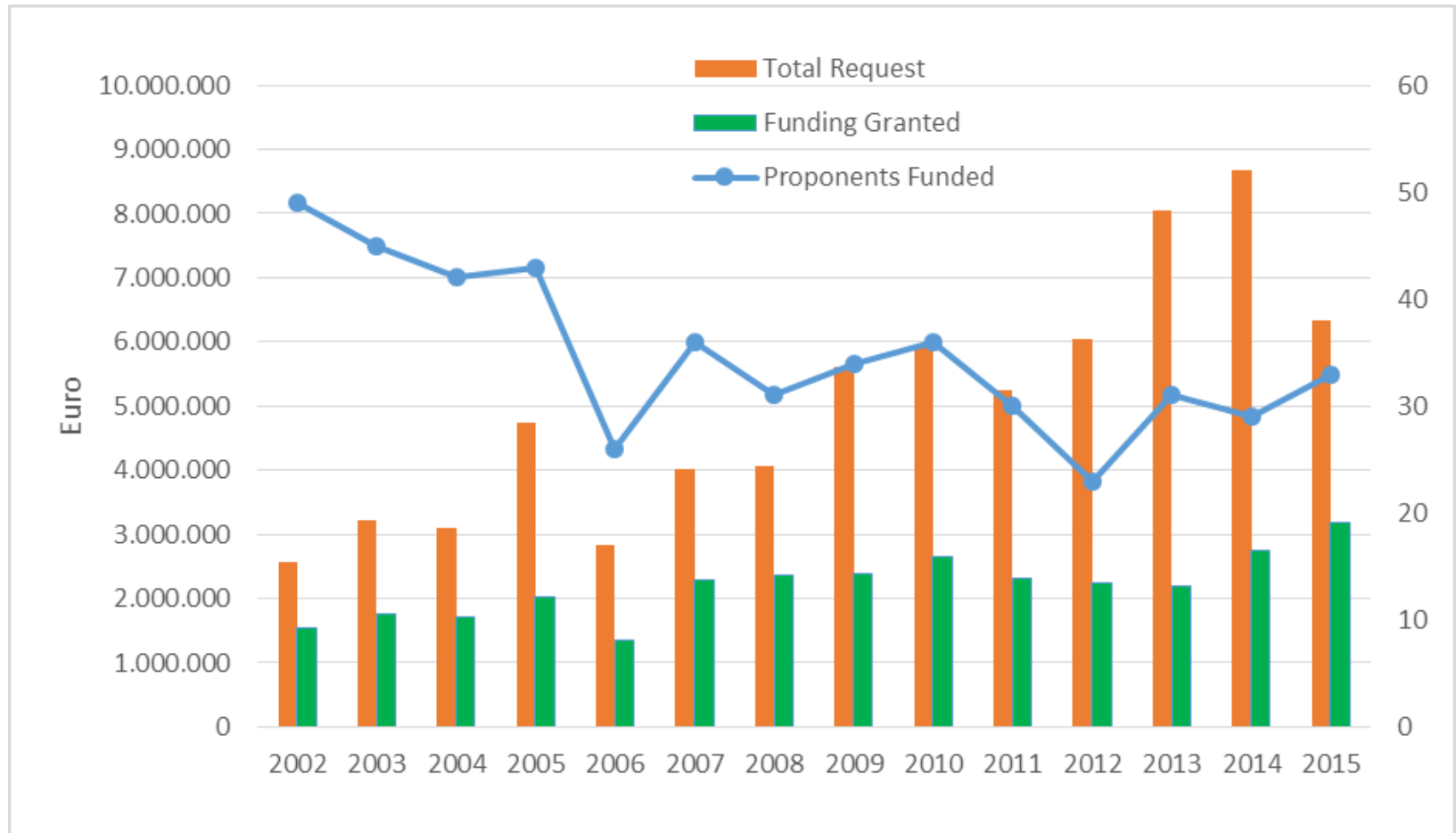
Project Funding – Priority Programme SPP 1006

If you submit a proposal:

- ▶ Annual deadline (usually August)
- ▶ Funding period currently 2+1 years
- ▶ Funding can be requested for
 - Scientific staff
(students, PhD students, post-docs)
 - Consumables, ect.
 - Travels
 - Also: PI's own temporary position
- ▶ Annual budgeted currently 2.3 mio Euro

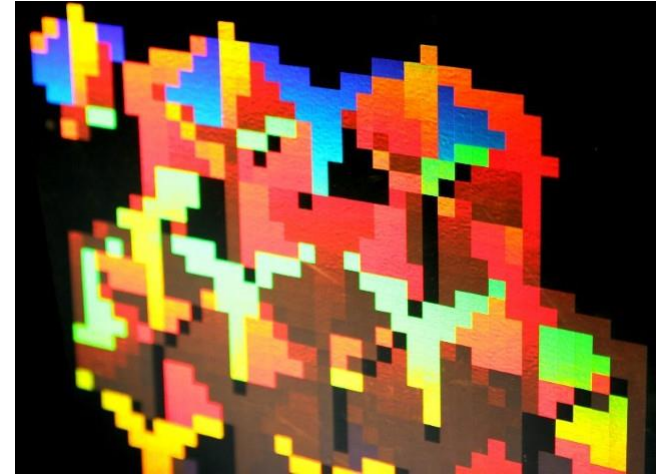


Priority Program 1006 „ICDP“ – funding history



Annual joint IODP-ICDP Colloquium

- ▶ Funded through coordination funds
- ▶ Organized alternately by IODP and ICDP coordination office
- ▶ Approx. 250 participants from both communities
- ▶ Includes GESEP School for young scientists
- ▶ Newly included: Show „Unterirdisch“ aiming at school children
