Much of 2023 was spent by many dedicated persons generating geochemical, lithologic, high-res photographic, hyperspectral etc. reference data sets. I believe we now have an excellent data set which will provide a very solid framework for our research and for which we will be envied in the community.

A special "thank you" to Cindy from ICDP who is acting as our temporary database manager; she is going with a fine comb through our data in mDIS. We are looking for a BASE member who would be willing to do this (part-time) more permanently.

The 1050 samples which the 41 participants of the first sampling workshop took to their labs may seem a lot but average only about one sample every 3 m drilled, that is, only three samples probing two adjacent core trays! Large parts of the core are poorly or not sampled at all; there is running room. Please think about BSc / Honor's / MSc-sized projects and additional sampling.

A second sampling workshop has been scheduled in Spandau for Monday, March 11, and Tuesday, March 12. Members of the Bremen-Münster sed-strat group will log core already earlier. Only a few BASE members have registered; it will be rather informal.

Christoph has been invited by GSSA to present on BASE through <u>Alex du Toit lectures</u>, hosted by several South African universities, in the second half of February.



We will hold a Moodies field workshop in Barberton, arrival July 15, departure July 20; pay your own expenses; bring your own transport.
